WILDFIRE MITIGATION



YOUR HOME IS YOUR LIFE BE PREPARED THIS WILDFIRE SEASON

WHAT

Landowners can receive technical and financial support to manage wildfire risk. Apply before July 30, 2017. Limited funds available.

Our goals are to protect landowners, property and our firefighters.

HOW

Have your home and vegetation assessed for risk from wildfire. Funds are available if you take action now.

TCD is not a regulatory agency - the assessment provides landowners with accurate information to use in making management decisions for their property.

THE PROCESS

Getting help starts with a property assessment.



- 1 Schedule a visit at tetonconservation.org with our [easy online form application](#). (Go To Programs -> Wildfire)



- 2 On-Site assessment takes place with the landowner and TCD. A voluntary mitigation plan is written.



- 3 Landowner or contractor implements the project utilizing the mitigation plan.



- 4 Landowner receives reimbursement after completion and inspection of recommendations in the plan.

FAQ

We're flexible and work with you personally for the best outcome on your property.

How much vegetation do we need to clear?

It's not clear-cutting. We use National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards as a basis for recommendations, and strive to balance your values as a landowner, including wildlife habitat, aesthetics, screening, and more.
